PASTOR'S CORNER

This September flew by in a blur. The tediousness of summer quickly overcome by the sudden re-starting of things. It was as if school and Sunday School and Confirmation Classes, along with the sudden return of our families after summer break, broke suddenly upon us, ready or not. Things simply needed to start happening, COVID or not. And while the fall surge following the summer slump is normal every year, this

year's breaking dam felt so much different, as so many things do right now.



So, fall is here, and with-it October. And October has for many years now been my favorite month of the year. The fact that the first weekend of October now also marks my anniversary as pastor here at RLC makes it even

sweeter. Two years down, but what a strange time it has been. Added to that the fact that we will not be able to mark this fall with the usual fall festivities of codfish and apple pies and ladies' bazaars makes it even stranger still. Like a bad love song, we really didn't know how much we loved these things until they were gone. But prayerfully, hopefully, not gone for good. Let's not even use the word cancelled. Simply on hold for when better times, safer times, come back around.

But beneath the annual calendar of social events, most of which were cancelled — oops, not held, and beneath the regularly scheduled school events, some of which are able to carry on and some not, another calendar flies by. The Church calendar. The annual cycle of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Pentecost. The annual changing of the guard and changing of the colors: blue, white, green, purple, white again and green to the end. Reformation Sunday, the end of October, and All Saints Sunday, the beginning of November, signaling the two-minute warning that this old church year is rapidly coming to an end. And that a new year in the church, the new Advent, the new coming of the Christ-child, will all too-soon begin.

And there is nothing that the Coronavirus can do to stop the annual cycle of the Church calendar going forward, as it has now, for nearly two-thousand years. And I find an odd source of comfort in that. Because during the month of October, while most people are thinking about what their kids or grandkids will wear for Halloween, my thoughts are on planning for Christmas. And when Christmas comes and most people are thinking about whose house Christmas is "at" this year, my thoughts are planning for Lent. And when Ash Wednesday hits and we mark our foreheads with an ashen cross, reminding us of our morality, my thoughts are thinking Easter. And so it goes for the pastor. The



yearly Church calendar always calling the Church forward, forward, into a new day. A better day, a better year.

And there is nothing that the Coronavirus can do to stop the Church of Jesus Christ from going forward, as it has now, for nearly two-thousand years. Seven months after we were forced to shut our doors, we now know that to be true. You can make the Church stumble, but you can't make it stop. Whether its in parking lots or pews, drive-up communion or church on the web, the Church, like it's calendar, will find a way to keep moving forward. Oh yes, we also now know how much better, how much richer,

the church is when it is in person. (Again, like that love song, we really didn't know this until it was gone). And yes, now we also now know how much we relish simple things like the Men's Codfish Dinner, believe me, I've fielded many a phone call. But perhaps this too is for the best.

Many have said that they look forward to 2021, mostly so they can begin to forget 2020. But I hope that is not what happens. I hope that 2020 becomes the year in which we began to appreciate the simple rituals, traditions, and habits that make up 90 percent of our daily life. And in 2021, not only renew our commitment to these simple things, but do so with a renewed vigor and strength. And while the scientists and specialists and politicians all say we have a long, long way to go yet to get to the end of this Pandemic, we now know this for certain: the Church will remain. And Christ will remain. And with Christ's help, we will get through it, together. One month, one week, one day at a time.

FAMILY EDUCATION


