

PASTOR'S CORNER

I walked out of the education wing door the other day and noticed a couple admiring the restored stained-glass window on the north side. They had been watching the progress of the project on their regular walks by the church. I introduced myself, although they already knew me from a past funeral, which is not uncommon. And of course, they had past connections and current family here at RLC. They belong to a much more liberal Lutheran Church in the area, as they put it, "for family reasons." I firmly believe in the Motel 6 motto: "We'll leave the light on." It was a good conversation. Hopefully, they know the door is always open.

After 165 years of doing church in this community, the door has swung back and forth many times. Not that long ago, the choice was made by RLC to move away from that more liberal Lutheran denomination to something we found closer to home, closer to our understanding of scripture, closer to what we believe. My last congregation in Nebraska was actually one of the 26 charter congregations of Lutheran Congregations in Mission in Christ, making the move way back in 2001. The association that now numbers over 950 churches. In talking with Pastor Perry Fruhling, our association's coordinator of pastoral ministry, that number is going to start climbing again soon as more and more Lutheran congregations see the light and breakaway from the ELCA.

Along with that, similar moves are happening in the United Methodist Church, and have already happened in the Presbyterian Church in the USA. Even the Southern Baptist Church, is finding it increasingly difficult to try to keep control over the vast diversity of beliefs and Biblical understandings of its 16,000 congregations under one gigantic roof. Change in churches, and entire denominations, is more normal than we might have been led to believe.

Heritage. On Sunday, August 1, we will pause for a moment to reflect on our heritage. Our past, present, and future, at RLC. Former Pastor Jim Nelson (1983 to 1992) will be our guest preacher. Many of you were baptized, confirmed, married, or heard words of consolation from Jim while he pastored this flock. A potluck/cookout, complete with kids' games over in the city park, will follow the 9:15 service. It will be a good day to celebrate our past, but an even better day to reflect on the blessings of our present. And with that, it is a fantastic day to invite a friend, family member, neighbor, or former member. It's part of the whole "leaving the light on" thing.

I am always very conscious of the fact that you have many choices of which church to attend on a Sunday morning. The old "we've always been a member of that church and we will always be a member of that church" idea really

ended quite a while ago. My father still adamantly believes that. His loyalty to the congregation that he has been a member of since the late 1950's really astonishes me. The number of reasons why someone attends one church over another is also astonishing. RLC is not and cannot be a church that offers everything that everyone wants. But we are Lutheran, biblical, and traditional on purpose; that is our place and our calling in this community. For many people, that is what they want.

I believe I have said from time to time, we are: Christ centered, Bible based, family focused and mission minded. The first two we do very well, at least in my opinion. The third, family focused, we are starting to do much better with the addition of Kristin Burdey as our youth director. The last one, mission minded, we do quite a bit of, but we just don't talk enough about what we do (for example in 2020, \$35,262 went to support local, national and international missions. Yes, it's a big door!) This is what being Christ centered is really all about – serving and loving others.

Indeed, this is our heritage, our past, present and future. This is who we are at Rushford Lutheran Church: Christ centered and Bible based. And that, my friends, is what "leaving the light on" means. That it is not about us, it's about Him. Or, as Jesus himself put it: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12, ESV)

Homebound, Nursing Home and Hospital Visitation

Pastoral visitation and worship services have returned to normal at our local nursing homes. Worship services open to all residents at Good Shepherd home are now each Thursday at 1:30. Currently they are being held in the dining hall rather than the chapel at Good Shepherd in order to provide better social distancing. Pastor Steve is one of six area pastors that lead these services. He will be leading the community service on July 22. Due to the large number of RLC residents we have living at the home, Pastor Steve also does a service for RLC members on the third Monday of each month. The date for July is the 19. Pastor meets with the residents at Bremmer Suites and the Apartments in the community room at Bremmer at 1:00 p.m. He then meets with RLC members at the nursing home in the activity room at 1:30 p.m. The service is typically a couple of hymns, a brief devotion, and Holy Communion.

If you or a family member needs to be on the Homebound List due to the inability to safely attend public worship, please contact Pastor Steve directly.

Hospital visitation are still being restricted to a small number of family at all of our area hospitals. The exception to this is in the case of imminent death. If you desire a pastoral visit while in the hospital please add Pastor Steve to your visitor list during admission, or notify the spiritual services department at the hospital. You do need to specifically request that your pastor be allowed visits while in the hospital. As always, please let us know here at church when you are in the hospital so that you may be included in prayers. Due to HIPPA regulations, hospitals do not notify congregations when a member of a church is admitted.

Good Samaritan Society Home Care

If you are homebound and need a skilled service, you may qualify for Good Samaritan Society Home Care Program. With a doctor's order for Skilled Service by your primary care physician, a registered nurse would complete an assessment to determine if an individual would qualify and what Skilled Service would be beneficial to the individual and goals would be discussed.

There was a round table set up with each of the symbols, including a white tablecloth, a white plate with a slice of lemon on it. A glass, a vase with a red rose, a Bible and an American flag. She explained what each of the symbols represented. She then read the poem, "In Flanders Field". Annika Bakkum-Ekern



sang two songs, "America the Beautiful" and "Battle Hymn of the Republic" accompanied by Beatty Darr on the guitar. The group sang "You're a Grand Old Flag. The program was then turned over to Coy Pederson, who is a grandson of Darlene Chiglo. He is a graduate of Loras College and is attending law school in Idaho. He gave a very interesting talk on Vexillology, which is the study of flags. He told the history of how flags came to be and what stars and stripes stand for. He showed examples of many different country flags, including the Norwegian flag. He showed the Minnesota flag and told what the different symbols stood for. He also explained about the Christian flag. He told how a flag as a military honor is folded with 13 folds before folding it into a triangle. The program closed with the group singing "God Bless America".


