




### Feature Movie: “I Can Only Imagine”

## PASTOR’S CORNER

Recently, I read an article that made a connection between the end of the Spanish Flu Epidemic and the start to the Roaring Twenties. The intent of the article was to predict what might happen when “things return to normal”, that is, post-Covid 19. Dates of the Spanish Flu were 1918 to 1920. And, of course, dates of the roaring twenties were the 1920’s. The article and author, whose origin is now lost in the shuffle, attempted to make the point that the progressive, liberal, and morally tumultuous twenties were a cultural and somewhat normal reaction to the incredible death and devastation of the epidemic. Deaths from the Spanish Flu numbered around 675,000 in America. Then again, the population of our nation was much smaller. We and the rest of the world were still struggling to come out of World War I. So I’m not sure the comparison between the two epidemics is really fair.



Still, it’s something to think about. Will the rest of this decade, oddly enough exactly one hundred years later, become another roaring twenties? While the first roaring twenties saw a renaissance of art, culture, and, of course, the invention of Jazz, it also saw the renewal of crime (think The Godfather/Mafia, illegal drinking and sleazy dancing). Television was not yet on air to promote all of this, and even the Golden Age of radio had not yet begun. Americans watched all of this—the Mafia, the Charleston, the Speakeasy—through the pages of the print media. That is, newspapers. Of course, journalism was still journalism in the 1920s, and the purpose of the news was to spread the news. So America got what they got for news straight up. All the news that’s fit to print, with very little slant.

I think it is hard to say if the rest of the 20s will end up being a cultural response much like the roaring twenties. I think it is just as likely that the current polarization of our culture will continue to be the dominant theme. However, most of us yearning minimally for that elusive “return to normal”. (Our culture doesn’t really do “normal” anymore, does it?) And if there is one defining factor of Covid life, it is the monotony. Thus, the pump has really been primed. We have had it up to here with rules, restrictions and regulations. So yes, I think our culture is quite ready for a party. A party that lets lots of many of the normal rituals and responsibilities. Meaning that here in America, we may be headed for an even deeper and faster moral decline than before.

And this, at a time when the church (along with communities, schools and family) has been weakened by the Covid-19 Pandemic. By “church” I am not referring to our own congregation, but the Christian Church in


America as a whole. Most historians would agree that the church's influence on our culture has been waning since at least the 1960s. Church attendance in the United States peaked around 1974 (meaning percentage of American's attending church weekly). Although it is hard to know whether the moral decline caused church attendance to drop, or dropping church attendance led to moral decline.

Meanwhile, the church (including RLC) needs to keep doing what the church has always done. Be salt in society. Be light no matter how dark the culture. Indeed, the darker things get, the brighter the light looks. However, when Jesus called us to be salt and light, a city on a hill, one can question whether he meant "the church" or individual Christians, that is you and me. The church, which is comprised of sinners in need of savoir, never really excels at paving the moral high road. Indeed, is it really the church's purpose to be the primary dictator of American morality? That has never worked well in the past. In the past that role has been done by family, school and

community, or minimally, by the church working in concert with these other pillars of society. It was never expected that "the church" be the sole moral backbone in America.

Another way of looking at this is that the church is always "in the world, but not of the world". Which is something Jesus reminds the disciples of a couple of

times during that Upper Room meeting we are talking about on Wednesday nights. The church, when it is doing what it does best, is sort of like home in that way. We must live out of our lives, our jobs, our relationships out "in the world". We also need a place to step away from "that world". To be a place that is loving, caring and welcoming. The world doesn't always need us to be the ones pointing out what is wrong with it. The world does not need somewhere to go when it gets tired and weary and afraid of what is wrong in the world. That is the type of church I believe people are going to need as we move further into this very strange decade.



Especially, if this coming decade begins to roar, like it did one hundred years ago. History repeating itself; the roaring 2020s. The church, by God's grace, got through it the first time. It will get through it again.

## **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

### **Homebound, Nursing Home and Hospital Visitation**

Covid-19 mandates and the safety of our elderly continue to restrict visitation to many of our nursing home members and those who are hospitalized. Hospital regulations currently restrict hospital visitation to one or two immediate family members. This regulation may be waived if the person hospitalized is placed on hospice care or death is imminent. This hospice exception also applies to members of our church living at Good Shepherd. In February, Pastor was able to visit Bremmer Suites Assisted Living residents since none of the residents or staff currently have Covid-19. However, visitation by pastor to the nursing home unit itself has not yet resumed. Members living in the Good Shepherd apartments and in their homes are able to receive pastoral visits and Holy Communion.

Due to the large number of our members who are either elderly or dealing with cancer or long-term illnesses, the visits are not monthly (there are currently 38 members on pastor's visitation list) Pastor has set Monday mornings aside for private communion for members who still need social distancing due to health concerns. Please call the church on Monday mornings if you want to come in (507-864-7152).




